

Woodstock Horse Sport Club Revegetation and Rehabilitation

Community Planting

You are invited to participate in a community tree planting with Woodstock Horse Sport Club members and project partners Powerlink Queensland and Townsville City Council. Five hundred trees and shrubs have been planted in three previous plantings, and a further two hundred will be put in the ground at this event.

The community tree planting is part of a project by the Woodstock Horse Sport Club to rehabilitate the banks of the creek running through the Townsville City Council Sport and Recreation Reserve. The area will provide habitat for many native finches, including the endangered Black-Throated Finch. The Chinee Apple weed has now been eradicated and local native riparian vegetation is being established to provide new habitat.
