

Dalrymple Road Community Planting






You are invited to join Community Environment Fund and Greening Townsville staff and volunteers for the second community planting event on Dalrymple Road between Bayswater Road and Nathan Street.

Native shrubs, trees and ground covers will be planted to contribute to the expansion of native urban habitat help to reduce the visual impact of the nearby transmission line. More than 1,000 trees have already been planted at the site during this year's National Tree Day planting.

Everyone is welcome to participate in this community planting. All site preparation (including hole digging) will be done by Townsville City Council's Greening and Waterways Team prior to the event. Activities on the day will include tree planting, fertilising, mulching and watering.

Event Details

- When : 8:00am to 11:00am on Saturday, 30 September 2006
- Where : Corner Dalrymple Road and Nathan Street (access from Dalrymple Service Road)
- Bring : Hat, gloves, sturdy closed footwear, sunscreen and drinking water

Community Environment Fund

The Community Environment Fund is a three-year project funded by a \$500,000 community grant from Powerlink Queensland, and \$500,000 from project partners the Townsville City Council and Thuringowa City Council.

The Fund aims to form partnerships and undertake projects that enhance the environmental properties of the Townsville and Thuringowa region, and to minimise the visual impact of the electricity infrastructure owned, operated and maintained by Powerlink Queensland.

Greening Townsville is a commitment to plant 10,000 trees per year through shade tree plantings, free trees, revegetation projects, community involvement and schools. Target areas include parks, streets, main roadways, industrial precincts, car parks, shopping centres, drains and waterways.
